

Wimborne

Wimborne is a market town in East Dorset, first mentioned in 701AD, and stands at the confluence of the rivers Allen and Stour, with easy access to the Jurassic Coast, New Forest and Cranborne Chase. It is only 5 miles to miles of beaches. Whilst much new building is taking place, its current population is approximately 20,000 in the wider Wimborne area.

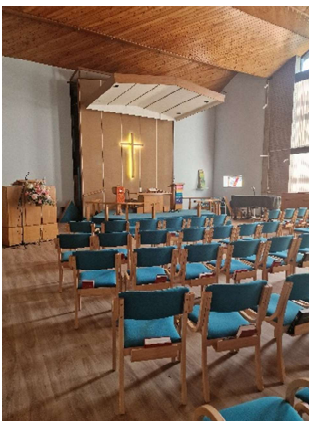


Transport and Connections

There are good bus routes to Bournemouth and Poole, with further connections to the wider area. Rail travel can be accessed from Poole and Bournemouth, with links to London. Bournemouth airport is fast developing for holiday traffic, with regular flights by Ryanair, TUI, and Jet2.

Amenities

The busy centre has two supermarkets, with further large outlets within the area. It has two primary schools, a middle school and a large upper school, as well as a special needs school, with a sixth form. Being a popular town for visitors, it has plenty of cafés, restaurants and independent shops. It has a 500+ seater theatre, library and museum for local history. It also has a small minor injuries hospital, supported by local charities.



The Methodist Church

Wimborne Methodist Church is fortunate in having a modern well-equipped building located in the centre of Wimborne.
