Good News regarding Reverend Dr. Mark Kimber: Starting in September 2025, Reverend Dr. Mark Kimber will continue his ministry at Blandford and Colehill Methodist Church and start his ministry at Wimborne Methodist Church.

On Thursday 7th November the Chair of the Southampton District (Reverend Rachel Bending) rang Joyce to say that as a Circuit we had matches for the group of Churches at Wimborne, Colehill and Blandford and the group of Churches at Ringwood, Crowe, Highcliffe and Mudeford Lane. On Saturday 9th November, the Stewards from Wimborne, Colehill and Blandford Churches together with the Circuit Invitation Committee (CIC) met at Wimborne Methodist Church with Mark. He will be joining the Circuit as a part-time Circuit Minister with pastoral responsibility for Wimborne, Colehill, and Blandford. The visit proved a very positive one and the CIC felt sure that Mark was exactly the right person needed to continue the Lord's work alongside the three congregations. As protocol insists, time was allowed for him to discern if the placement was the right one for him. With this in mind, Joyce waited until Monday 11th November to ring Mark asking for his decision. His answer was a resounding yes. We can now tell you all that Mark will be a part-time Circuit Minister with pastoral responsibilities for the Methodist Churches at Wimborne, Colehill and Blandford starting in September 2025.
