Spell bound and intrigued for two hours listening to David recount the ins and outs of his life made me realise that each of us has a story to tell. However, come this July when Rev Ros Hollingsworth also sits down they will be moving to a village near Gillingham in Dorset to begin the next chapter on their journey of faith.
